LWC grew to over 30 in that living room. Space was rented in the Western Hills Shopping Center on Highway 105. God blessed with donations of sheetrock, carpet, and pews, and on October 2-4, 1992, the first anniversary of LW C was celebrated with the dedication of the new facilities. Before long the church doubled in size and the 60-person storefront was outgrown. LWC found its next church home in 1995 across Highway 105 from April Sound, renting a little white community church.

In 1996, Randy Ensey's parents joined LWC and J.R. Ensey became the associate pastor. In 1999, LWC moved to 2080 Longmire Road, with Michael Ensey serving as assistant pastor from May, 2000 to December, 2009.

In 2001, LWC began to broaden its vision and extend its spiritual influence beyond the four walls of the new building. From 2002 to 2010, Lake Conroe Youth Conference, sponsored through efforts of LWC, made a monumental impact on the youth of Texas and beyond. It began at the convention facilities at Del Lago Resort. Outgrowing that, it moved to the Lone Star Convention Center in Conroe, peaking at over 1,800 in attendance.

LWC caught the vision of sacrificial giving, giving well over \$1,000,000 in the past 25 years to various UPCI endeavors. LWC also provided the financial resource in 2006 to build churches in Dobe Toga and Busha, Ethiopia. These churches are thriving today under the effectual leadership of Solomon Lodamo and his son, Tesmesgen Lodamo.

Now, in 2017, LWC has again outgrown the building we currently occupy. We have plans to build a new church on the property we own next door. Ground breaking will be in January, and construction will continue throughout the year. We invite you to join us in this Harvest of Generosity.
